- Encourage volunteering and community service focused on justice and inclusion.

The **Office of Ethics and Institutional Development**, together with student affairs and legal departments, will coordinate the policy. Indicators include:

- Number of awareness and civic education programs
- Participation in student governance and public engagement
- Reports of institutional transparency and accountability
- Student and staff feedback on justice, fairness, and safety

This policy will be reviewed biennially with input from students, faculty, and administrative units. It will be updated to align with evolving national governance standards, legal frameworks, and UN guidance on SDG 16.
