

BAKU ENGINEERING UNIVERSITY POLICY ON SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOAL 1: NO POVERTY

1. POLICY STATEMENT

Baku Engineering University (BEU) is committed to contributing to the eradication of poverty in all its forms, in alignment with **Sustainable Development Goal 1 (SDG 1): No Poverty**. This policy outlines BEU's strategic approach to reducing poverty through inclusive education, financial support, research, and community engagement.

2. OBJECTIVES

- To ensure equitable access to quality education for students from lowincome and disadvantaged backgrounds.
- To support research and innovation that address poverty-related challenges in Azerbaijan and globally.
- To engage with communities in poverty alleviation through outreach, partnerships, and capacity-building initiatives.
- To promote employability and entrepreneurship among students, especially those from vulnerable socio-economic backgrounds.

3. GUIDING PRINCIPLES

- **Equity and Inclusion:** Prioritizing support for underprivileged students in all academic and administrative processes.
- **Sustainability:** Promoting long-term solutions to poverty through education, employment, and innovation.
- **Partnerships:** Collaborating with government bodies, NGOs, and international organizations to maximize impact.
- **Transparency and Accountability:** Ensuring fair and transparent processes for financial aid and community programs.

4. KEY STRATEGIES

4.1 Financial Support

- Provide need-based scholarships, tuition waivers, and stipends for lowincome students.
- Maintain a transparent financial aid application and review system.

4.2 Inclusive Education

- Promote access to university for first-generation students and those from marginalized communities.
- Offer preparatory programs and academic support services to bridge learning gaps.

4.3 Research and Innovation

- Encourage research projects that focus on poverty alleviation, income inequality, and social protection.
- Support interdisciplinary collaboration among faculties on SDG 1 themes.

4.4 Employability and Entrepreneurship

- Provide career guidance, skills training, and internship opportunities for economically disadvantaged students.
- Facilitate startup incubation and entrepreneurship programs targeting low-income youth.

4.5 Community Engagement

- Organize outreach activities, including free training programs, workshops, and public lectures in low-income areas.
- Partner with local municipalities and NGOs to support regional development initiatives.

5. IMPLEMENTATION AND MONITORING

- The Vice-Rector for Academic Affairs and the Office of Student Support Services will jointly oversee the implementation of this policy.
- Annual reports will be published to track progress, including the number of supported students, outreach projects, and poverty-focused research outputs.
- Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) will be aligned with national and UN metrics for SDG 1.

6. REVIEW AND REVISIONS

This policy will be reviewed every two years to ensure alignment with national development goals and evolving global SDG frameworks.
